


Capitol Visitor Center

TEACHER WORKSHOP

Learn about the design and construction of the U.S. Capitol from 1793-1866.

- Which section of the Capitol was completed by 1800?
- Who were the architects of the Capitol?
- Why did the Capitol come within five votes of being moved back to Philadelphia?
- What were the reasons the Capitol was expanded and how were Jefferson Davis, Thomas U. Walter and Montgomery Meigs central to that story?



Teachers will have an opportunity to work with primary sources including drawings of the Capitol, correspondence regarding the Capitol, and excerpts from the Annals of Congress and the Congressional Globe.

The workshop will feature a talk by Thomas Fontana, Director, Communications and Marketing Division, U.S. Capitol Visitor Center.

Following the workshop, teachers are invited to participate in an optional tour of the U.S. Capitol. Certificates of attendance will be provided.
